She was born on the island of Java, in the city of Yogyakarta, and grew up in a family of teachers and urban planners. She earned her bachelor's degree in Geography at *Universitas Gadjah Mada (UGM)* and completed both her master's and PhD at *Queensland University of Technology (QUT)*.



At *QUT*, she received the *Student Leader of the Year Award* in 2015, becoming both the first international student and the very first PhD student ever to win the award.



After completing her PhD, she returned to *UGM* in 2017 and has been leading the *Sustainable Urban Futures* research cluster since 2019.

Afterward, she also works as a reviewer for Indonesia's city-planning agency *BAPPEDA* and serves as an expert for various NGOs.



She advises the city of Yogyakarta and other municipalities on climate-action plans and organizes workshops on participatory planning.

For this work she has received several awards, such as the *Indonesian Young Planner Award* in 2021.
